- It shows us the justice and wrath of God in punishing sin (Genesis 6; 19)
- It shows us the love and grace of God in implementing His plan of redemption (Genesis 3:15; 12:1-3; 49:10)
- It is the foundation of the Bible (Psalm 11:3)
